Most non-Americans assume that English is the official language of the United States, particularly as the USA has the largest population of any English-speaking country. In fact this is not the case, and for more than two hundred years Americans have got by without declaring English their official language.

Language diversity has always been a part of American culture. As early as 1664 when the island of Manhattan passed from Dutch to British hands, 18 different tongues were spoken there, not counting any of the hundreds of Native American languages spoken in North America at that time. Today it is estimated that there are 329 different languages spoken in the United States, including English. The majority of official paperwork is completed in more than one language. For example, California offers the driver's license exams in 30 different languages, New York in 23 and Michigan in 20. In all, 38 states out of the 50 offer the exam in languages other than English. Most public offices, such as the Social Security Administration, employ bilingual staff to help the non-English speaking members of the public.

Today, demographic research shows that now more than ever, there is a massive shift towards immigrants to America learning English. Although the number of minority language speakers is increasing, all available evidence suggests that today's newcomers are learning English – and losing their native tongues – more rapidly than ever before.
